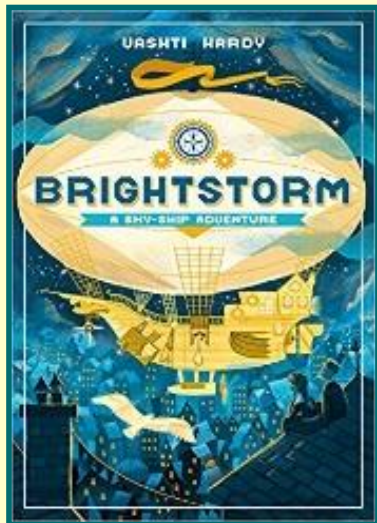
## Book 1: Matilda by Roald Dahl

## Book 2: Brightstorm by Vashti Hardy

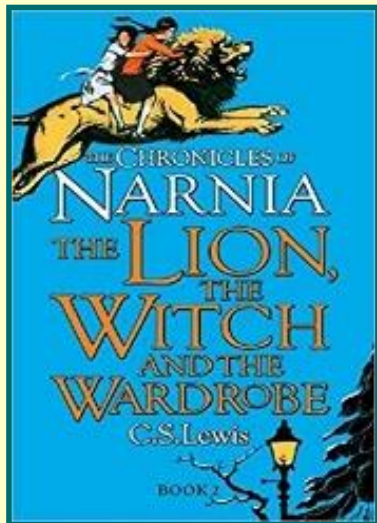

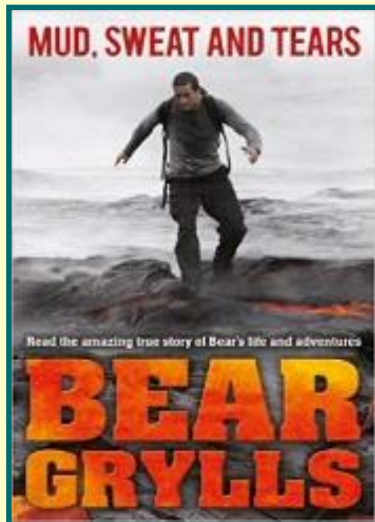

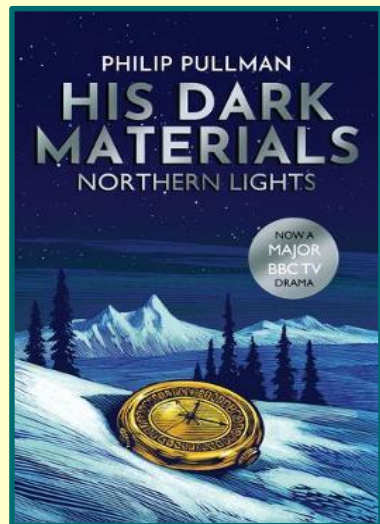
