




The biggest threat to achievement english

An apprenticeship is a real job, with a real employer, where the apprentice will work fulltime whilst learning new skills and knowledge towards the apprenticeship standard.

Apprenticeship benefits

Apprenticeships are an exciting paid option for anyone wanting to gain experience, upskill or change career because they offer the chance to earn a wage whilst they work and study.

A-Levels

Short for Advanced Level. A-Levels come after GCSEs. They usually focus on academic subjects, compared to vocational qualifications like BTECs and NVQs, which are more practical. There are more than 40 different A-level subjects on offer - some will be subjects that you studied at GCSE and others maybe new.























Vocational courses

A training programme which focuses on practical work. The 'Vocational' part of the name refers to the fact that this course prepares you for a vocation - a particular skillset required in different types of jobs.

T-Levels

Short for Technical Levels. T-Levels are a practical, employer-led alternative to A-Levels, designed to get students work ready.

Structure of a T-Level

- A technical qualification, which includes:
- · core theory, concepts and skills for an industry area
- · specialist skills and knowledge for an occupation or career
- · an industry placement with an employer

Foundation courses

A foundation course will help you build your confidence and improve your knowledge and skills.

Taken at colleges and training providers, either in a range of subjects or in one subject to give the student an introduction to that subject or course, preparing them for additional learning programmes or employment.
